ZERO TO THREE brought a baby and their family from all 50 states and DC to Capitol Hill to tell their Members of Congress to Think Babies!


Families amplified the need for Congress to invest in policies that support good health, strong families, and positive early learning experiences – because when babies succeed, we all succeed.




Social Content Highlights












